

The Taranganba Way of Reading ^[1]

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Student learning new vocab

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Join us for this twilight event exploring how Taranganba State School, a regional school in Queensland, used the power of diagnostic data to enhance students' literacy and build a love of reading.

In 2011, NAPLAN data showed that Year 3 reading levels at the school were below the state and national mean. The school leadership team realised that they needed to find an approach to reading that would provide a solid foundation for all of their students.

In 2013 the school began working with Associate Professor John Munro, University of Melbourne, to implement his High Reliability Literacy Procedures – a set of explicit literacy teaching procedures that teachers in all subject areas could use to enhance students' literacy knowledge.
